**Website
Privacy
Policy**

We take the privacy of people visiting our website very seriously. This policy explains what we do with the personal information of our website visitors to all areas of the site, including Community Lifestyles.

1) Information that is not personal

When you visit our website, we will collect information about your computer and about your visits to and use of this website including your geographical location, cursor activity, browser type, referral source, length of visit and number of pageviews. We do this to find out things such as the number of visitors to various parts of our website. We collect this information in a way that does not identify you.

2) What personal information do we collect?

We may collect, store and use the following kinds of personal data:

- (a) information that you provide to us for the purpose of registering with us including your name, address and email details;
- (b) information that you provide to us for the purpose of subscribing to our website services, email notifications and/or newsletters (including your name and email); and
- (c) any other personal information that you choose to send to us via our online forms, for example relating to complaints, reporting repairs, etc.

3) Cookies

A cookie consists of information sent by a web server to a web browser. This information is stored by the browser and sent back to the server each time the browser requests a page from the server. This enables the web server to identify and track the web browser. This can also make your web browsing easier.

We use cookies on the website. We use these cookies to keep track of you whilst you navigate the website. Session cookies will be deleted from your computer when you close your browser.

Most browsers allow you to reject all cookies, whilst some browsers allow you to reject just third party cookies. For example, in Internet Explorer you can refuse all cookies by clicking "Tools", "Internet Options", "Privacy", and selecting "Block all cookies" using the sliding selector. Blocking all cookies will, however, have a negative impact upon the usability of many websites, including this one.

4) Using your personal data

Personal data submitted on this website will be used only for the purposes specified in this privacy policy.

We may use your personal information to:

- (a) administer the website;
- (b) improve your browsing experience by personalising the website;
- (c) send you email notifications which you have specifically requested;
- (d) send to you our newsletter and other marketing communications where you have specifically agreed to this, by email or similar technology; and
- (e) deal with enquiries and complaints made by you via the website.

Where you submit personal information for publication on our website, we will publish and otherwise use that information in accordance with the license you grant to us.

5) Disclosures

We may disclose information about you to any of our employees, suppliers or subcontractors insofar as necessary for the purposes as set out in this privacy policy. Any third parties to whom we provide your details will have signed a contract with us to meet the same high standard of data protection we provide.

In addition, we may disclose information about you:

(a) to the extent that we are required to do so by law;

(b) in connection with any legal proceedings or prospective legal proceedings; and

(c) in order to establish, exercise or defend our legal rights. Except as provided in this privacy policy, we will not provide your information to third parties without your express permission.

We use some external services such as Mailchimp, Google Analytics, Facebook, Twitter and Hotjar. These services may host data on servers outside of the European Union subject to their own Privacy Policies. You can access the privacy policies of each of these services as follows:

6) Security of your personal data

We will take all reasonable technical and organisational precautions to prevent the loss, misuse, destruction, alteration, unauthorised disclosure of or access to your personal information. Of course, data transmission over the internet is inherently insecure, and we cannot guarantee the security of data sent over the internet.

7) Retention of your personal data

If you have provided personal information to register with us, to subscribe to our website services, newsletters or marketing communications, you can inform us at any time if you wish to withdraw from these services or communications and we will delete your information immediately.

Information provided through on line forms, such as reporting housing repairs, is delivered directly to the relevant staff and is not held on this website.

8) Policy amendments

We may update this privacy policy from time-to-time by posting a new version on our website. You should check this page occasionally to ensure you are happy with any changes.

9) Your rights

You may ask us to provide you with a copy of any personal information we hold about you or to rectify or erase your information. You may also request a copy of your personal information in a format allowing you to transfer it to another data controller. You may instruct us not to process your personal data for marketing purposes by email at any time. (In practice, you will usually either expressly agree in advance to our use of your personal data for marketing purposes, or we will provide you with an opportunity to opt-out of the use of your personal data for marketing purposes.)

10) Third party websites

The website contains links to other websites. We are not responsible for the privacy policies or practices of third party websites and would encourage you to read the privacy statements on these websites.

11) Updating information
